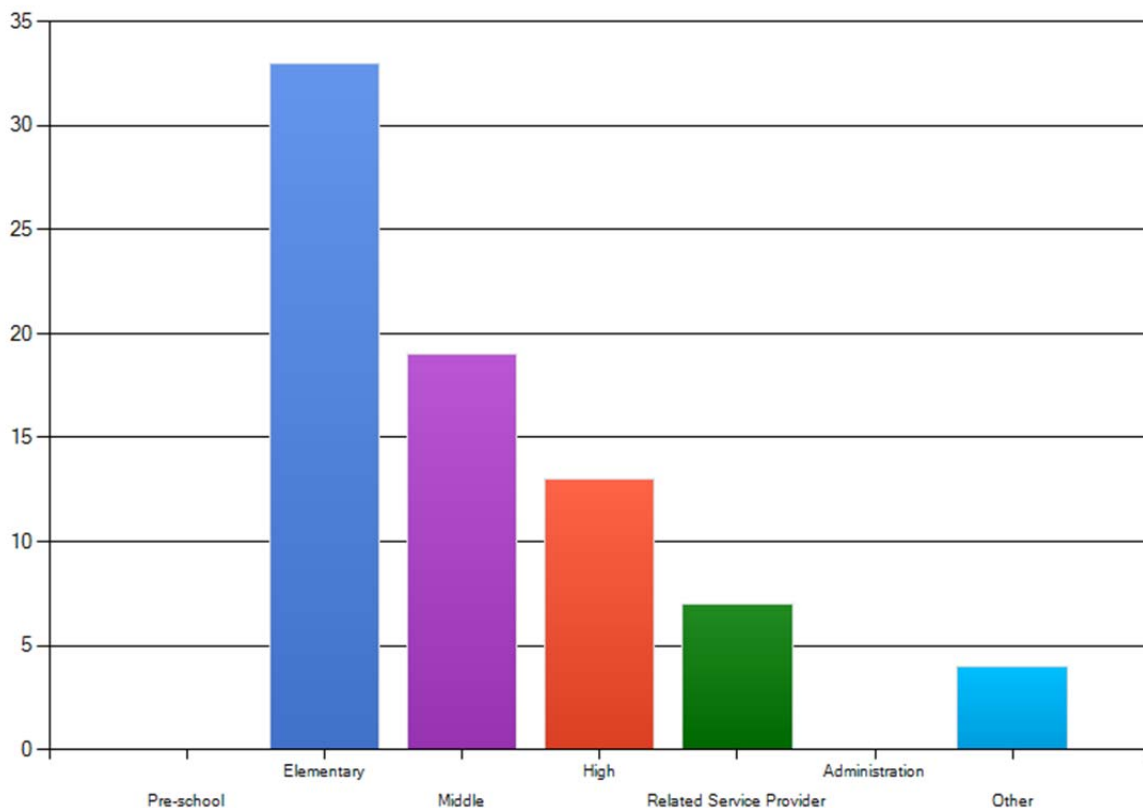
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Teacher Survey June 2013

In June 2013, ten schools in Livingston County were asked to complete the post-implementation survey for violence prevention in their classrooms and schools as a whole. Five schools responded to the request for completion; Avon (29), Dansville (6), Keshequa (1), Livonia (1), and York (27). The graphs in this report summarize the findings from the surveys. The most widely used programs across schools were Second Step and PBIS. Of significance you will note:

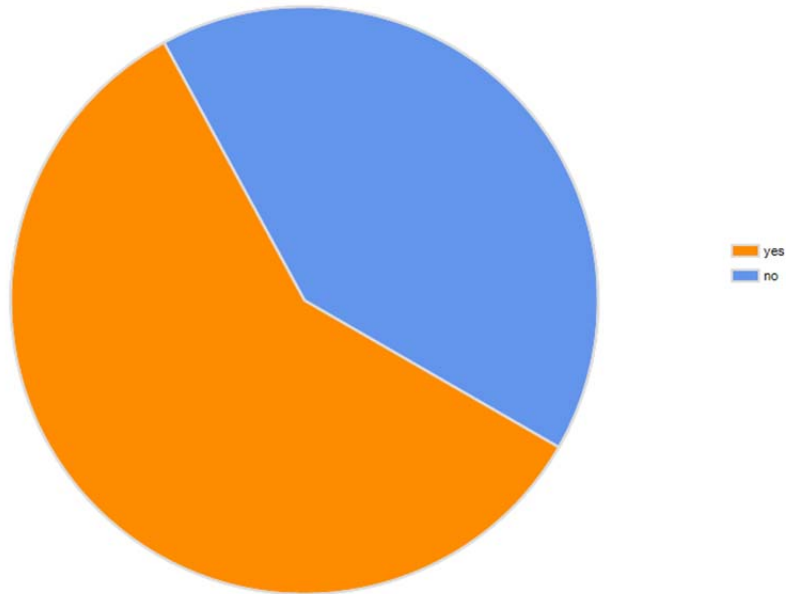
- Teachers observed kids using the skills taught in the program on a daily and weekly basis (majority response).
- The majority of teachers reported the behaviors of students improved throughout the year.
- Teachers reported that calming down and learning new strategies were the most observed skills acquired.
- Most teachers reported they are happy with the amount of violence prevention being implemented in their school, while a large group says they need more implementation.
- Teachers reported that they generally believe that a problem with bullying exists depending on the grade level of students.
- Most teachers did not get training in the Dignity for All Students Act (DASA).

What grade level do you teach?

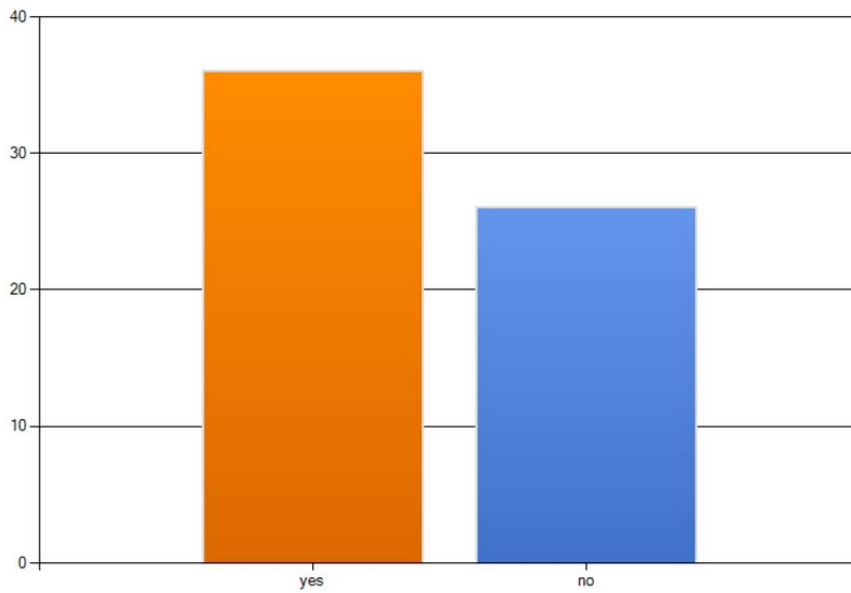


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Did you teach a Social Emotional Learning Program (Violence Prevention, anti-Bullying) in your class this year?

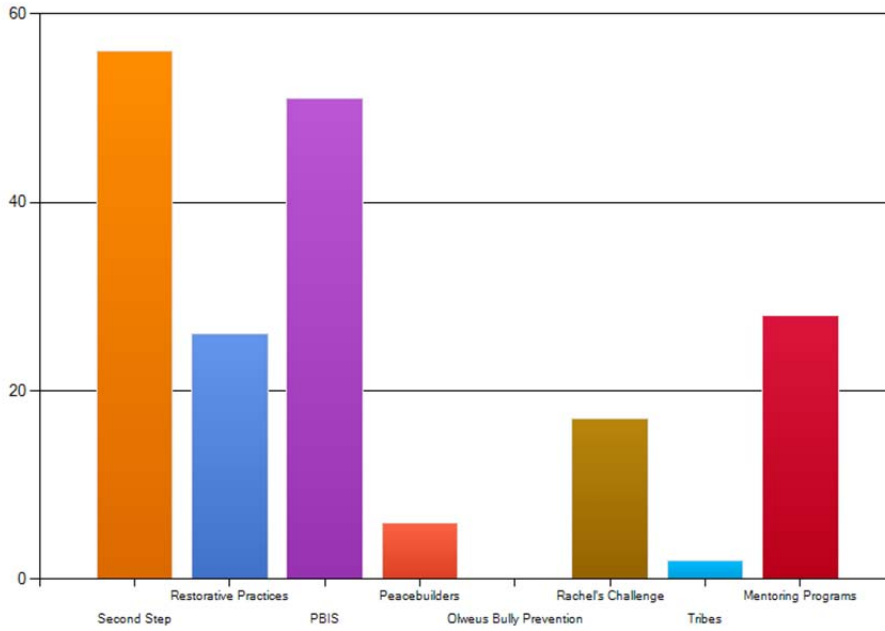


Did you teach an anti-bullying or violence prevention program within your school this year, not specifically in your classroom?

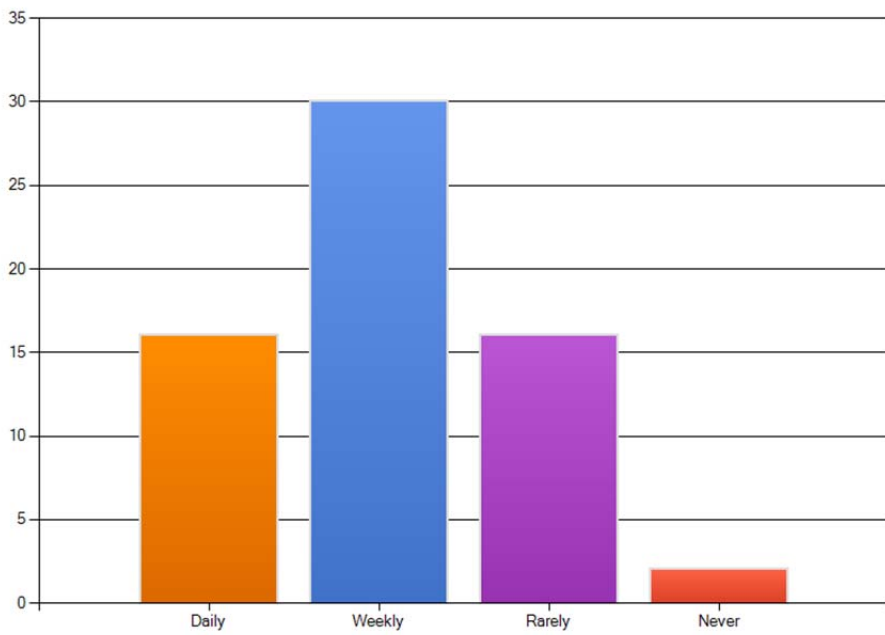


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Does your school use any of the following programs?

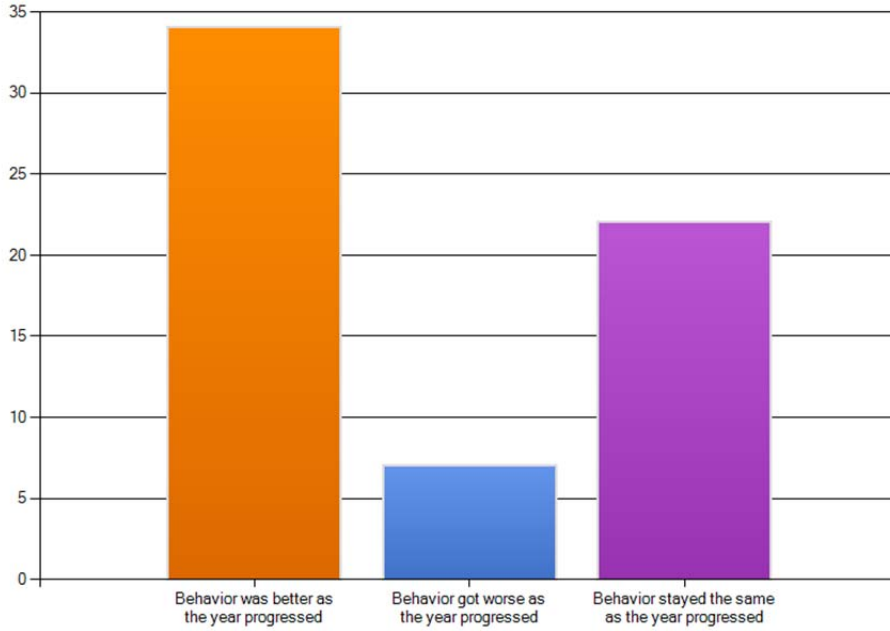


Do you see or hear children using the skills taught in the program?

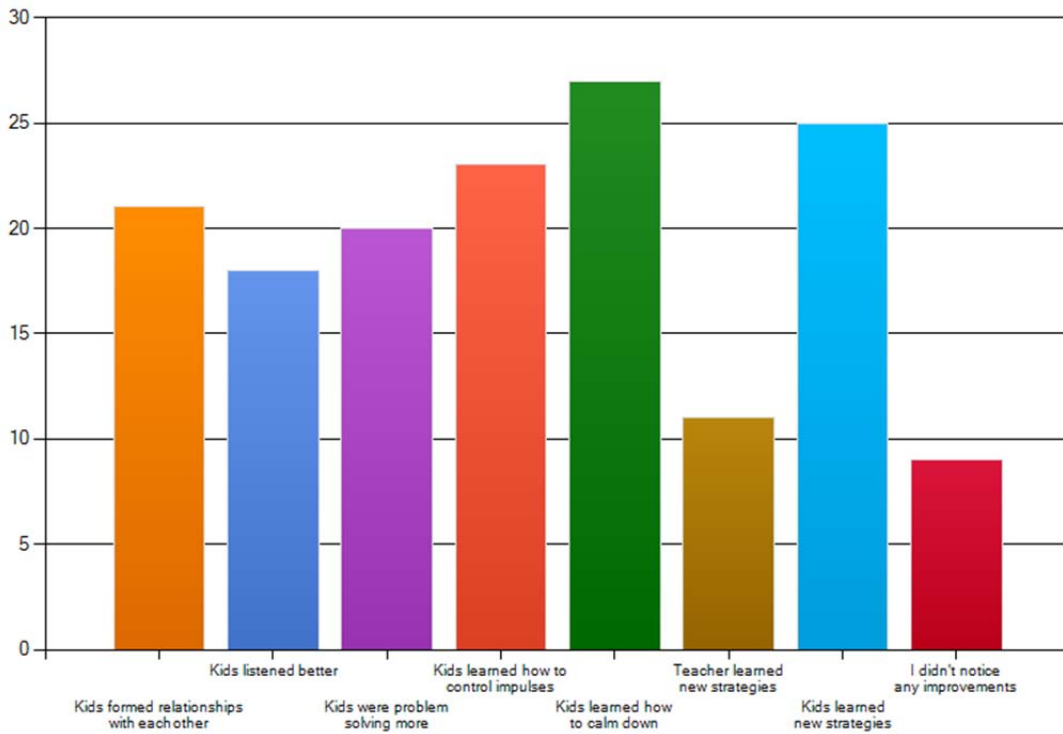


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Did you notice a change in behavior as the year progressed?

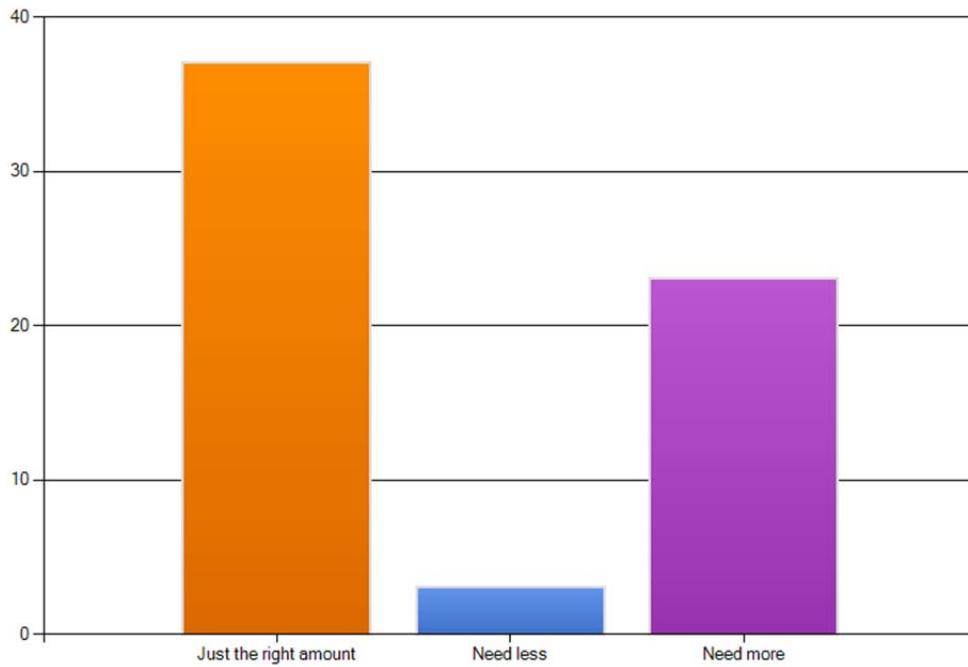


If you saw an improvement in behavior as the year progressed, what were changes you noticed?
